

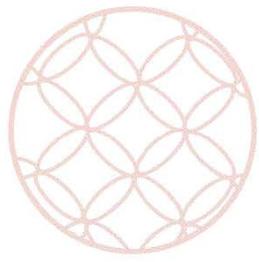

<b>TOPIC</b>	<p><b>Learn 21st Century Skills: Make Your Own Digital Story!</b></p> <p><i>Teaching Access learners to make meaningful videos using their own recorded voice and images into a three-minute multimedia artifact.</i></p>
<b>SESSION GOALS</b>	<p><b>Academic Goals:</b></p> <p><b>Enhances English Language Skills</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Digital storytelling provides a platform for students to practice speaking and understanding English through creating and sharing their stories in English.</li><li>• By working on their digital stories, students improve their language proficiency, vocabulary, and grammar in an engaging and interactive way.</li></ul> <p><b>Develops Communication and Critical Thinking</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Digital storytelling encourages students to think critically as they plan, organize, and present their stories.</li><li>• Students learn how to effectively communicate their ideas, thoughts, and emotions in English, developing their communication skills.</li></ul>

	<p><b>Teambuilding and Leadership Goals</b></p> <p><b>Supports Personal Growth and Leadership</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Through digital storytelling, students have the opportunity to grow as individuals and prepare for leadership roles as Digital Mentors.</li> <li>• Students learn about service learning and can publish digital stories on the service projects that make a difference in their communities.</li> </ul>

It combines language learning, cultural exploration, technology usage, and community service in a creative and empowering way.</p>

<h2>Part 2: Plan the Session</h2>	
<h3>MAKE A PLAN</h3>	<p>In <i>Learn 21st Century Skills: Make Your Own Digital Story!</i>, Access learners will follow this plan:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• First, learners will watch and analyze sample digital stories for the key elements of narrative.</li> <li>• Next, they will brainstorm their own story.</li> <li>• Then, they will write and edit their story.</li> <li>• Next, they will record and edit their story in their own voice</li> <li>• Then they will find and take images to illustrate their story.</li> <li>• Next, students will learn how to upload music and images to create a multimedia piece in an online digital platform.</li> <li>• Finally, learners will share their own work in a screening of workshop digital stories</li> </ul> <p><b>MATERIALS:</b> Internet connection; laptops (one per two learners); posters, notebooks, pens, stickers, etc.</p>
